Air Quality Upgrades For All District Buildings

With an awesome 2022-2023 school-year ending, we are already focused on the improvements we can make to our district for next year and beyond. We have huge news that will have a lasting impact on the district in terms of improved air quality, efficiency, and structure sustainability. This summer (2023), Arnold Elementary and the upstairs of Keicher Elementary are going to receive significant upgrades including improved temperature controls, conversion of steam to hot water (where applicable), and the ability to take stagnant air out and bring fresh air in. While the Covid experience did illuminate the need, the district had already identified improved infrastructure and air quality as our top priorities.



We were able to finance the majority of our "Phase One" project (at Arnold and the upstairs of Keicher) utilizing federal grant funding, but in order to complete the upgrades in the remainder of the district we created a bond proposal which will appear on the August 8, 2023 ballot. The bond proposal would finance "Phase Two" of the air quality projects to include the rest of Keicher and the entire Jr./Sr. High School. The goal for the district would be to have all district school buildings (Arnold, Keicher, Jr/Sr High) receive upgraded temperature controls, increased climate comfort, more efficient (and cost effective) conversion of steam to hot water, and the ability to remove stagnant air while bringing in fresh, healthy air. These upgrades will improve air quality and reduce costs due to improved efficiency. It will also prolong the shelf life of our 1940's and 1950's constructed buildings.

The bond proposal (August 8) is estimated to be completed WITHOUT increasing the bond debt millage from the current rate due to taxable value growth that has been experienced in the school district in the past several years. The current bond millage rate (from the 2016 bond) is 2.90 mills. The annual millage levied for this bond proposal is not anticipated to exceed that rate. Rather, the millage rate would continue for longer.

If the proposal passes, the 2016 bond repayments, *originally scheduled to end in* **2046**, *would be extended to* **2054**. That would generate 6.3 million dollars for the district which would be spent on the "Phase Two" upgrades detailed above. However, the 2.90 mills is NOT estimated to go all the way through 2054 as that number (2.90) IS ESTIMATED TO BEGIN DECLINING IN 2032.

There will be an abundance of information being released all summer long with details, FAQ's, etc related to the August 8, 2023 Bond proposal, but if you have any questions, please feel free to contact Brady Cook (brady.cook@mccardinals.org) at your convenience.




History comes Alive!!
